*** Note to all. This draft counts 100 points, and the final draft counts 100 points. However, to arrive at the total of 200 points for the entire paper, the final score will be weighted double by doubling the second score, adding it to the first draft score; this total will be divided by 3 (yielding an average percent) and then multiplied by 200 (to give the points out of 200). Example: 1st draft: 85; final draft 95: $85 + 95 + 95 = 275/3 = 91.7\% \times 200 = 183$ points. Also, if you have a 95% or higher on the first one, you have the option of making this your final draft (although you may want to revise it if you want to have a good writing sample); I do set slightly higher expectations on the final draft so if you have a 93% and do not make the suggested improvements, it's possible to go down.
