Works in Progress

Richard C. Gamble is editing a 14 volume set of selected articles on Calvin and Calvinism. Each volume will include an introduction by the editor. Approximately 300 articles will be included, all in the English language. (New York: Garland Publishing Co., October 1990).

Professor Dr. A. Heron of the Lehrstuhl für Reformierte Theologie in Nürnberg is collaborating with Professor Dr. George Stroup of Columbia Theological Seminary on a collection of readings in Reformed theology from the 16th to the 20th centuries for Westminster/John Knox Press.

Richard F. Wevers, of Calvin College's Dept. of Classical Languages, is using his sabbatical to work on two Calvin projects. 1) A computer produced, lemmatized concordance after the pattern of his Calvin's Latin Bible Concordance and his 1539 Institutes Concordance. 2) A computer search program for either mainframe or personal computers to find words, partial words, or pairs of words in varying distances from each other. This program, with data and index files, will be able to search Calvin's Latin Bible, Calvin's 1539 Institutes, or Calvin's 1559 Institutes.
