Grading Rubric

CAS 101 and 200 papers

In an analysis of another speaker, did the student who wrote the essay address the majority of the following:

Topic

Was the topic appropriate for the occasion and audience? Was the topic well researched?

Organization

Did the introduction gain the audience's interest? Were the main ideas of the speech easy to follow? Were transitions and connectives used effectively? Did the conclusion provide closure and a memorable ending?

Language

Was the language clear and concrete? Was the language vivid and colorful? Was the language appropriate to the topic, audience, and occasion?

Delivery

Did the delivery enhance the message? Did nonverbal communication add to or detract from the speech? Was strong eye contact maintained throughout most of the speech? Were pauses, rate, pitch, and vocal variety used effectively?

Ethics

Was there a balance between logos, pathos, and ethos? Did the speaker avoid overrelying on emotional appeals? Were there any fallacies? Did the speaker respect the audience?

The student writer should not focus on only one issue, but should reflect on the holistic qualities of an effective speech.
