- Quick & easy appointments: most students can be seen the same day or within 1-2 business days, minimizing academic disruptions




Off Campus Learning Opportunities

Place-based experiential learning

- Off-Campus Study: fall & spring semester; winter (January) & summer (May) intensives, spring break
- Outdoor Recreation: weekend, fall break, and spring break trips; outfitting rental center and bike shop; expeditionary field courses and climbing skills courses
 - Fall 2025 trips: Manistee River Paddleboarding; Sleeping Bear Road Cycle; Pine River Paddle; Pere Marquette; Dragon Mountain Bike; Pictured Rocks; Caving Adventure
- **Service Learning**: regular local service opportunities (e.g., community food banks, refugee education, senior support, women's shelter, etc.)
 - Spring Break 2026 trips: Outer Banks, NC (2 trips); Chicago; Atlanta; Philadelphia
- Alumni Association & CALL Travel: open to all friends of Calvin; uniquely planned by Calvin faculty, staff, or trusted alumni; travel experience woven with education and faith
 - 150th Anniversary trips: 6 continents, including South Korea & Japan, Egypt, Red Rocks, Peru, Italy, Netherlands, and Australia

Professional Campus Safety

More than security...

- 24/7 Coverage: around-the-clock patrols and incident response; specialized dispatch center
- Professional officers and dispatch operation: extensive staff experience (retired law enforcement or military)
 - Close partnership with area emergency response agencies and police departments
- Access control: robust card-access system and lockdown capability
- Extensive video surveillance: Over 350 cameras recording on campus
- KnightGuard App: one-stop resource
 - One-touch contact to Campus Safety dispatch
 - Direct link to virtual escort
 - Maps and parking information
 - Links to a variety of campus resources (e.g., emergency procedures, mental health resources, dating violence resources, tip reporting, etc.)
 - Emergency communications





Intentional Faculty Connections

Regular and sustained interaction



- Small Class Sizes/Low Student-Faculty Ratio: more than 40% of classes have fewer than 20 students, which fosters more meaningful participation, discussion, and interaction with peers and instructors
- Office Hours: opportunity to connect one-on-one with faculty; times listed in syllabus
- "Peets with Profs": opportunity to connect with professors over coffee/tea;
 sponsored by Student Senate; students can register online
 - Each pair receives two \$5 vouchers for Peets
- Student Research Opportunities: collaborative student-faculty research that provides inquiry-based learning opportunities
 - McGregor Undergraduate Research Program: arts, humanities, and social sciences
 - STEM Summer Student Research Fellowships: science, technology, engineering, & math
- Career & Professional Mentoring: industry connections; networking events; internships

Key Times to Plan a Visit

- Homecoming/Family Weekend: each fall, families and alumni are encouraged to visit campus to take part in annual traditions
 - Calvin Classic 5K & Youth Fun Run
 - Athletic events
 - Calvin Music Festival



- Calvin vs. Hope Rivalry: spanning more than 100 years, this annual rivalry is consistently ranked by ESPN and others as one of the best rivalries in collegiate athletics; basketball rivalry games are broadcast in January/February each year
- **Siblings Weekend**: Current students welcome siblings (college-aged or younger) or others they "love like a sibling" (e.g., cousins, close family friends, etc.) to participate in a weekend of special events and activities; held each February



Dining Innovations

Continuous Innovation in Dining

- Meal Plan Updates: Core 19, Core 17, Core 14, Core 7
 - Meals reset at the beginning of every week
 - Includes up to 2 flex meals (meal equivalency swipes at Johnny's or Peet's)
 - Includes up to 1 guest meal (allows students to swipe in a guest)



- Elevated dining programming: Exciting new features in Commons Dining Hall
 - In-house based goods (cookies, bars, pies); premium ice cream (3x/week)
 - Infused water station with rotating flavors; new Pepsi add-your-flavor shot; Gatorade on tap
 - DIY sandwich bar for quick grab-n-go during busy times
 - o BitFarms microgreen farm, housed and maintained in Commons Dining Hall
 - Zone allergy-friendly station is served and supported by an attendee
 - Special events: "Legacy of Light" dinner, "Generations of Food," & "John Calvin's Table"

Top Notch Academic Supports

Fostering Student Success



- **Early Alert System & Robust Coordinated Care:** invisible web of support quietly working behind the scenes to support students; proactive support/outreach
- Specialized academic counselors: focused support based on areas of expertise
 - Athletes 1:1 meetings; make-up testing for gameday conflicts; advising and scheduling
 - First-Generation students courses designed to help students navigate college-life
 - International students support with writing and English language
- Academic coaching: Free peer-to-peer support for everything outside of course content (e.g., time management, motivation, study skills, focus, motivation, learning strategies)
- **Tutoring:** free academic tutoring for most 100 & 200 level courses; evening study sessions for heavily-tutored courses (Accounting, Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Stats, Physics)
- Distraction-free space: Students can drop off their phones at the front desk of the Center for Student Success (off the hallway behind Peets) and have distraction-free study space

Career Preparation & Connections

From Exploration to Employment

- Career Hub (Virtual Career Center): central platform where students can
 explore interests, access job and internship postings, career resources, labor market data,
 and tools to support professional development. (https://career.calvin.edu)
- Calvin LifeWork: online curriculum of 30+ modules covering career readiness, leadership, financial literacy, and vocation- available to all students, who work at their own pace, in Moodle
- Career Coaching & Resume Labs: one-on-one coaching and daily resume labs (Monday through Friday, 3-4:30pm) to help students prepare for internships, jobs, and graduate school
- Exploration and Mentoring Programs: provide opportunities to shadow professionals, explore career fields, clarify professional goals, and build connections
 - Career Exploration Program early exploration of career fields through shadowing and networking
 - CISD Career Scholars Program selective mentoring and professional development through connection with industry leaders
- Career Fairs & Employer Events: signature opportunities to connect with regional and national employers, network with professionals, and secure internships or full-time work

The Legacy Lives On


- Chaos Night: a (mostly) friendly rivalry between residence halls featuring mental, physical, and creative challenges
- Cokes & Clubs: a fair highlighting student clubs, organizations, and activities that students can get involved in
- Grand Prix Bed Races: student teams design and decorate wheeled "beds" and race through a marked course
- Cardboard Canoe Race: students build canoes out of cardboard and compete to race/stay afloat in the Sem Pond
- MidKnight Madness: the official kickoff to Basketball season that involves students (and athletic teams) dressing in costumes and participating in a variety of contests
- Christmas Tree Lighting: a gathering on Commons Lawn in early December to light the campus Christmas tree, enjoy hot chocolate, cookies, and caroling
- Cold Knight Plunge: students (and some fac/staff!) jump into a frozen Sem Pond, striving to earn the "golden towel"
- The January Series: a world-renowned public lecture series in January, featuring distinguished authors, leaders, artists, and innovators from around the world. Open to all, it's a free liberal arts education (in-person or livestreamed)
- Dance Guild: a very popular performance (fall & spring) that is student-led and features a wide array of student dancers
- Rangeela: a cultural showcase, with high international student involvement, bringing together
 performances, fashion, and a celebration of the many cultures represented at Calvin
- Fall & Spring Formals: an opportunity for students to dress up, dance, and socialize in a fancier off-campus setting

- Calvin Ecosystem Preserve & Native Gardens: a biodiversity hotspot consisting of 104 acres (¼ of campus), 2 miles of trails, several benches, and beautiful ponds and lookouts, providing Sabbath space for plants, animals, and humans; celebrating its 40th anniversary!
- Nature Rx: alongside 98 other institutions, Calvin is part of the Campus Nature Rx Network, which recognizes that time in nature is proven to increase focus, decrease anxiety, and boost immune response
- **Proximity to Michigan Gems**: Calvin is less than an hour from some of the most beautiful spots in Michigan, including Lake Michigan, Frederick Meijer Gardens & Sculpture Park, and a variety of outdoor parks, trails, and scenic spots
