Mineral Spotlight: Astrophyllite

What do these mineral shapes remind you of – stars or snowflakes? Astrophyllite is a titanium silicate mineral whose name comes from from the Greek words *astron* meaning "star" and *phyllon* meaning "leaf", a reference to its often stellate crystal habit. In our sample, the dark brown mineral you can see forming starburst shapes is the astrophyllite; contrasting with its light pink felsic matrix.

Astrophyllite is very rare. It can be sourced from only a few, remote localities. It was discovered in Norway in 1854, but since then has been found in Quebec, Canada, Greenland, the Kola Peninsula of Russia, and Pike's Peak, Colorado.
