

THE UNDEFEATED: A Traveling Exhibition of Original Paintings by Kadir Nelson opens its 3-year national tour at the Center Art Gallery, in conjunction with Calvin's Festival of Faith & Writing. Inspired by the children's picture book of the same name, written by Newbery Award winning author Kwame Alexander, and illustrated by world renowned artist and author, Kadir Nelson, THE UNDEFEATED showcases Nelson's awe-inspiring paintings that bring to life Alexander's masterful poem through thought-provoking imagery. The exhibition aims to open a dialogue about diversity and inclusion and the weight of unreconciled historical truths in the hopes of healing, redemption, reconciliation, and restorative justice for individuals and communities.

Moving primarily between drawing, painting, and site-specific installations, Lundin's current work draws inspiration from ephemeral perceptions of light and space within every day architecture. Windows and walls become framing devices for playing with the expectations and desires elicited by the possibility of a view, suggesting presence and absence, limitation and possibility. By using one material to suggest another, the work subtly destabilizes the familiar, shifting the focus from what is seen to the experience of seeing (Lundin, 2019).

Rivalry in Print: Art and Competition in the Seventeenth-Century France

This exhibition showcases a remarkable collection of 17th and 18th century prints after the great rivals Charles Le Brun and Pierre Mignard, including Le Brun's Triumph of the New Testament, a series of five etchings made by Gérard Audran in 1681, illustrated here by impressions belonging to The Getty Research Institute (2003.PR.152). The exhibition is organized by Julia Bouwkamp, under the direction of Craig Hanson with assistance from Mary Najmon. The volume that inspired the scholarship and exhibition was recently gifted by a Calvin alumnus who also generously funded both conservation of the volume and the coinciding exhibition research and development.

It's a tale of magic, deception, revenge, and passion. Usurped by his brother and set adrift, Prospero makes a savage island his home. For twelve years, Prospero and his daughter Miranda live in isolation, until Prospero finds a means to avenge himself. A magician of great power, Prospero lures his enemies to shore by shipwreck, where he torments the wicked and tests the unproven. Scattered, the hapless survivors hatch plots, lose themselves, drink to excess, and are bewitched by Ariel. One fellow, the youthful Ferdinand, proves himself noble and worthy of Miranda's hand. The story ends with judgements rendered, wrongs righted, a wedding, and new beginnings for all.


